



# PBCN-EOC NOTICE

Issued on Sunday, September 1st, 2024

On August 13, 2024, Peter Ballantyne Cree Nation (PBCN) issued a **MANDATORY** evacuation order for its members in Sandy Bay due to the wildfire's threat, classified as a wildfire of note by Saskatchewan authorities.

As of August 28, 2024, the PBCN Chief and Council mandated a **MANDATORY** evacuation of Southend as another fire, approximately 1 km wide, approaches rapidly due to strong winds and is now only 1 km south of the Saskatchewan Highway's Camp.

\*\*\* If members decide to remain in the community despite the MANDATORY evacuation order, members must go to the Band Office to sign a waiver indicating their choice to stay.

\*\*\*By signing this waiver, band members acknowledge the risks and liabilities associated with refusing to evacuate: **PLEASE NOTE THAT EMERGENCY SERVICES MAY NOT BE AVAILABLE TO ASSIST THESE BAND MEMBERS SHOULD CONDITIONS WORSEN.**

## FIRE STATUS:

- **Current Conditions:** The fires around the PBCN communities remain uncontained and continue to burn. The Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency (SPSA) has advised that the situation remains volatile and continues to pose a significant risk. It is not safe to stay in the communities at this time.
- **Firefighting Efforts:** Please see maps at the end.
- **Support Assets:** The firefighting efforts are being supported by helicopters, fixed-wing aircraft—including water bombers—and heavy equipment.

**Tonight:** The surface inversion will build by 19:30CST. The surface ridge gives mainly clear skies. Slight risk of fog patches developing near waterbodies and in low-lying areas. A risk of land breeze, increasing wind speeds and causing wind direction to shift. Air quality advisory is in effect due to the smoke.

**Min Temp:** 7C. **Max RH:** 90%. **Winds:** NW 10-20 km/h > Light and variable > S-SW 10-20 km/h. **Precipitation:** Nil.

**Forecast for Sunday:** Inversion will break by 10:00 CST. The surface ridge will give mainly to partly sunny skies and southerly winds on its passage. An air quality advisory should be in effect due to smoke from the fires. Strengthening late in the evening a LLJ looks to be in place over the fire region. Surface inversion will build around 19:00 CST.

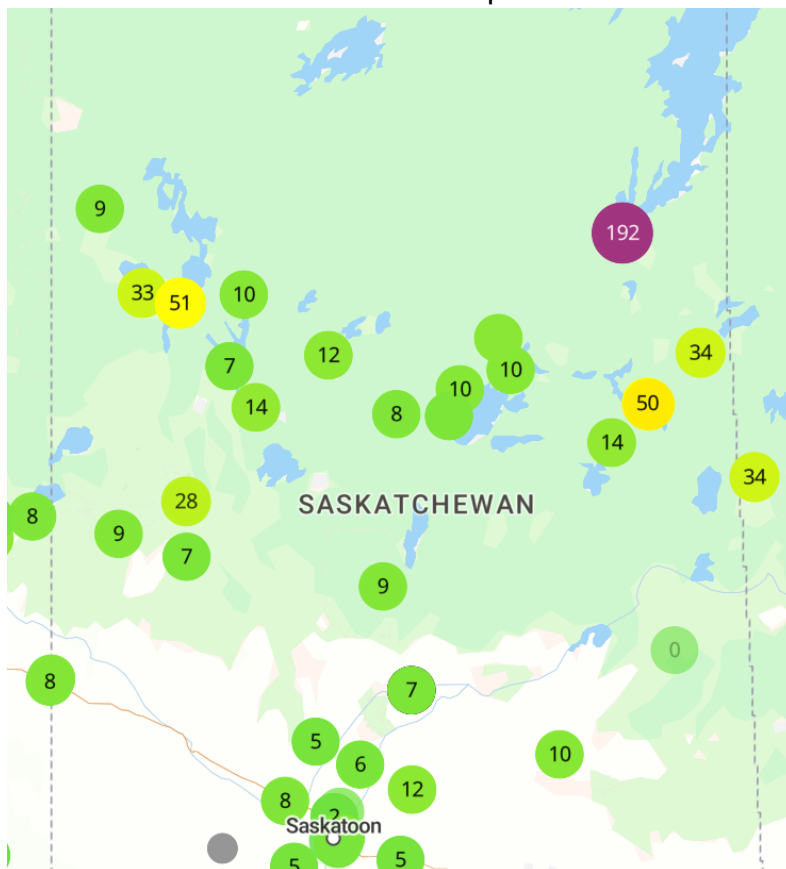
**Max Temp:** 23C. **Min RH:** 40%. **Winds:** SW 10-30 km/h > S 15-25 km/h. **Precipitation:** Nil.

**Forecast for Monday:** The surface ridge will give mainly sunny skies and southwesterly winds on its passage. A chance of a lake breeze, increasing wind speeds and causing wind direction to shift.

**Max Temp:** 28C. **Min RH:** 35%. **Winds:** SW 5-25 km/h. **Precipitation:** Nil.

## SMOKE ADVISORY

As of Monday, August 26, 2024, the Northern Inter-tribal Health Authority rescinded its regional air quality advisory, allowing for the return of PBCN members from Deschambault Lake who were displaced due to the smoke.

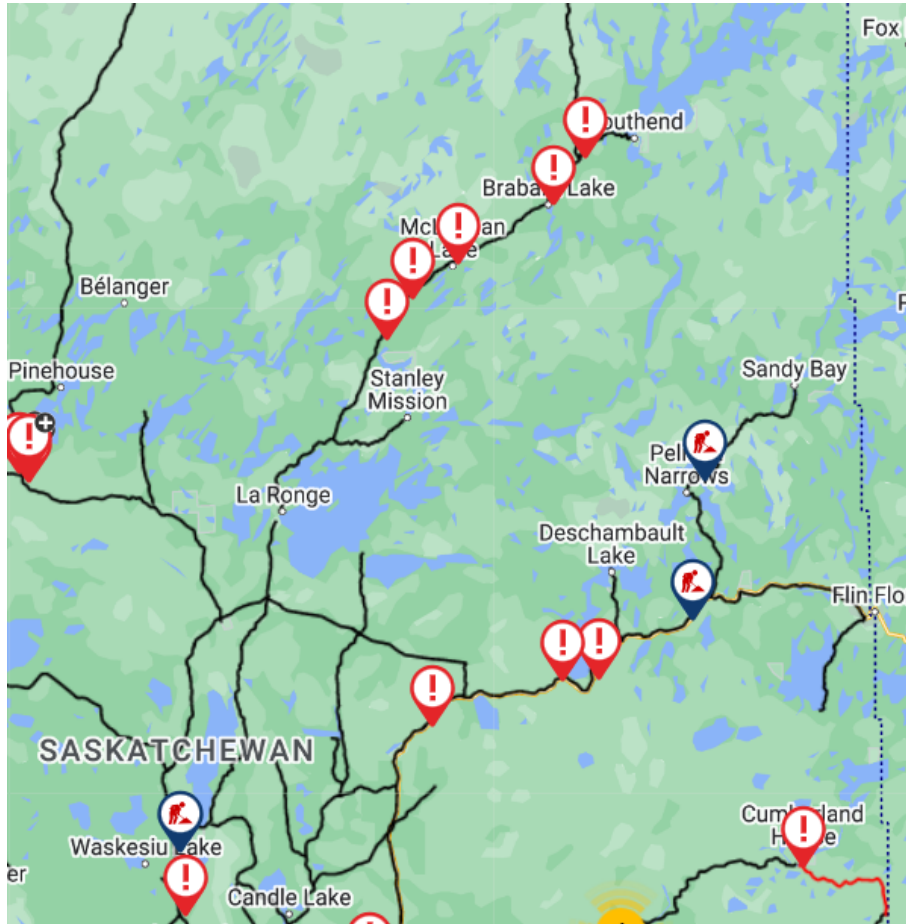


## Guidance on dealing with air quality issues caused by wildfires

- This has been a very busy wildfire season across western Canada and many communities in Saskatchewan have already been adversely impacted. The Prime Minister recently stated that many experts expect this to be the worse year for wildfires in Canada. So, it is especially important that communities and individuals be ready for the impact of fires and the resulting smoke.
- While many communities have solid evacuation plans for when fires get too close, many do not have as extensive plans for ensuring their people are safe when the threat is the smoke in the air. We urge you to begin planning for your communities' response to a prolonged period of heavy smoke in the air. You should consider arrangements to allow those most at risk from smoke to have access to clean air and moderate temperatures. This may mean establishing clean air spaces at community facilities or providing air purifiers to care homes and households with elderly, very young or pregnant individuals or those with ongoing heart or lung issues.
- Arrangements should be made to ensure that anyone required to work outside on smoky days, above a four on the Air Quality Health Index, have access to and be encouraged to wear a respirator or a well-fitting mask like a N95 or KN95. When the air quality poses a high health risk- above a seven on the Index, anyone undertaking strenuous work outdoor should be wearing an appropriate mask. The elderly or those with chronic heart or lung conditions may wish to wear one of these masks whenever there is smoke in air. Adult masks are available and can be ordered following the procedure for ordering PPE. A community should have enough of these masks on hand to provide at least a week's supply for outdoor workers, the elderly and those with chronic conditions. Our colleagues from British Columbia have a good resource on wearing and fitting a mask.

### **Sandy Bay:**

- CRC is providing commercial lodging support to individuals in Prince Albert and Saskatoon. CRC continues to coordinate meals and other requests from members of the community.
- Reception Centres in Prince Albert and Saskatoon continue to provide in-person support, including providing supplies for the tuck shop which are managed by the community.
- Mental Health personnel continue to conduct wellness checks for community members lodged in hotels.
- CRC Virtual Operations Team continues to support with outbound calls to community members who have called CRC with questions or requests for support.
- CRC is providing bus shuttles for community members to get around Saskatoon. Buses will circle between the hotel sites and a couple of retail locations in Saskatoon.
- In coordination with the community, CRC is working to facilitate some recreational activities.
- On 30 August CRC facilitated hotel transfer for community members in Saskatoon.

### **Deschambault Lake:**

- Between 10 August 2024 and 27 August 2024, CRC provided services to community members from Deschambault Lake who evacuated to Prince Albert. Community members returned to the community of Deschambault Lake on 27 August 2024.

### **Southend (Full Evacuation Order In Effect)**

- CRC reactivated a QR code on 27 August 2024 for community members from Southend to self-register via an online portal.
- On 27 August 2024, secured commercial lodging for community members with hotels in Prince Albert, Saskatoon, Regina and potentially Moosejaw.
- CRC deployed a team of responders to Regina on 28 August 2024 and 29 August 2024.
- CRC has established a reception centre in Regina to provide in-person support for community members.



## NORTHERN INTER-TRIBAL HEALTH AUTHORITY

### SANDY BAY (Full Evacuation Order In Effect)

- The community remains on a phased approach to a general evacuation due to direct fire threat.
- Air quality – Current models show high levels of smoke in the area for the duration of the models (48 hours). Improved air quality may be expected in the early morning of Sept 3, 2024.

### PELICAN NARROWS

- There is **no direct fire threat** to the community of Pelican Narrows.
- Air quality – Models show seasonal smoke in the area for the duration (48hrs). Appears that there may be higher levels of smoke settling in during the afternoon with reprieve coming in the early morning hours,
- Health recommendations are to monitor influx of smoke related illness at the clinic. Should persons experience symptoms of smoke related illness or worsening of chronic respiratory/cardiac conditions they are advised to seek the consultation of their health care provider. There is **NO** call to evacuate P1s or 2s at this time, those who may be required to be closer to a hospital will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis and dependent on their medical assessment might be sent for respite.

### DESCHAMBAULT LAKE

- There is **no direct fire threat** to the community of Deschambault Lake.
- Air quality – Models show seasonal smoke in the area for the duration (48hrs). Appears that there may be higher levels of smoke settling in during the afternoon with reprieve coming in the early morning hours,
- Health recommendations are to monitor influx of smoke related illness at the clinic. Should persons experience symptoms of smoke related illness or worsening of chronic respiratory/cardiac conditions they are advised to seek the consultation of their health care provider. There is **NO** call to evacuate P1s or 2s at this time, those who may be required to be closer to a hospital will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis and dependent on their medical assessment might be sent for respite.

### SOUTHEND (Full Evacuation Order In Effect)

- Community is under General evacuation.
- Air quality - Models show seasonal smoke in the area for the duration (48hrs). Appears that there may be higher levels of smoke settling in during the afternoon with reprieve coming in the early morning hours,



## SMOKE EFFECTS

“Smoke can cause increased coughing, throat irritation, headaches and shortness of breath” said Dr. Nnamdi Ndubuka, Medical Health Officer for NITHA. “Monitor your symptoms and seek medical attention if you get worse, particularly if you have a pre-existing respiratory condition.”

The following measures can be implemented especially if you have lung or heart trouble, are elderly or very young:

- Remain indoors during times that there is smoke in the air;
- If you have fresh air shelters in your community, please utilize as directed by local health officials;
- Keep doors and windows closed – if cooling is needed, use a fan or air-conditioning, if available;
- Reduce exercise and activity, especially outdoors;
- Be aware that outdoor events may be postponed or cancelled if smoke levels are elevated;

If you are experiencing increasing symptoms, more than irritation in the eyes, nose or throat, please see your local health worker or call HealthLine at 811 (from land line) or 1-877-800-0002 (from cell phone) at any time.

## EVACUATION INFORMATION

- 1. Registration Required for Any Support Services:** All evacuees from Southend must register using the QR code provided by the Red Cross. It is highly recommended that you register before you leave Southend.

- 2. People in their Own Vehicles.** Evacuees in private vehicles can obtain fuel in Prince Albert at the Petrocan, located on 2nd Avenue W., until 11 pm. Their names should be on a list of authorized individuals. Otherwise, members must contact either Councillors Jeremy Morin or Kevin Morin.



- Please proceed to the Reception Centre at the Days Inn in Regina, located at 3875 Eastgate Drive, Hwy 1 E, before 12 am. Anyone arriving after hours can call Gwen Pearce (Red Cross) at (306) 940-4218.
- If you are unable to reach Regina, you may obtain a temporary room by visiting the Reception Centre at the Ramada by Wyndham at 806 Idwyld Dr. N. in Saskatoon before 8:00 PM.

### **3. For Evacuees Staying with Friends and Family (Southend)**

- Councillors Jeremy Morin and Kevin Morin have compiled a list of evacuees' names who are staying with Friends and Family. For those on the list, cash cards will be available for pick up at PBCN's Cottage 13 in Prince Albert. The office hours are 9:00 am-5:00 pm.

### **4. Transportation and Shelter:**

- Arrangements are being made with the Canadian Red Cross for transportation to and temporary shelter in Prince Albert, Saskatoon and Regina.

### **5. Food:**

- Please inquire with Red Cross' Reception on where to access food.

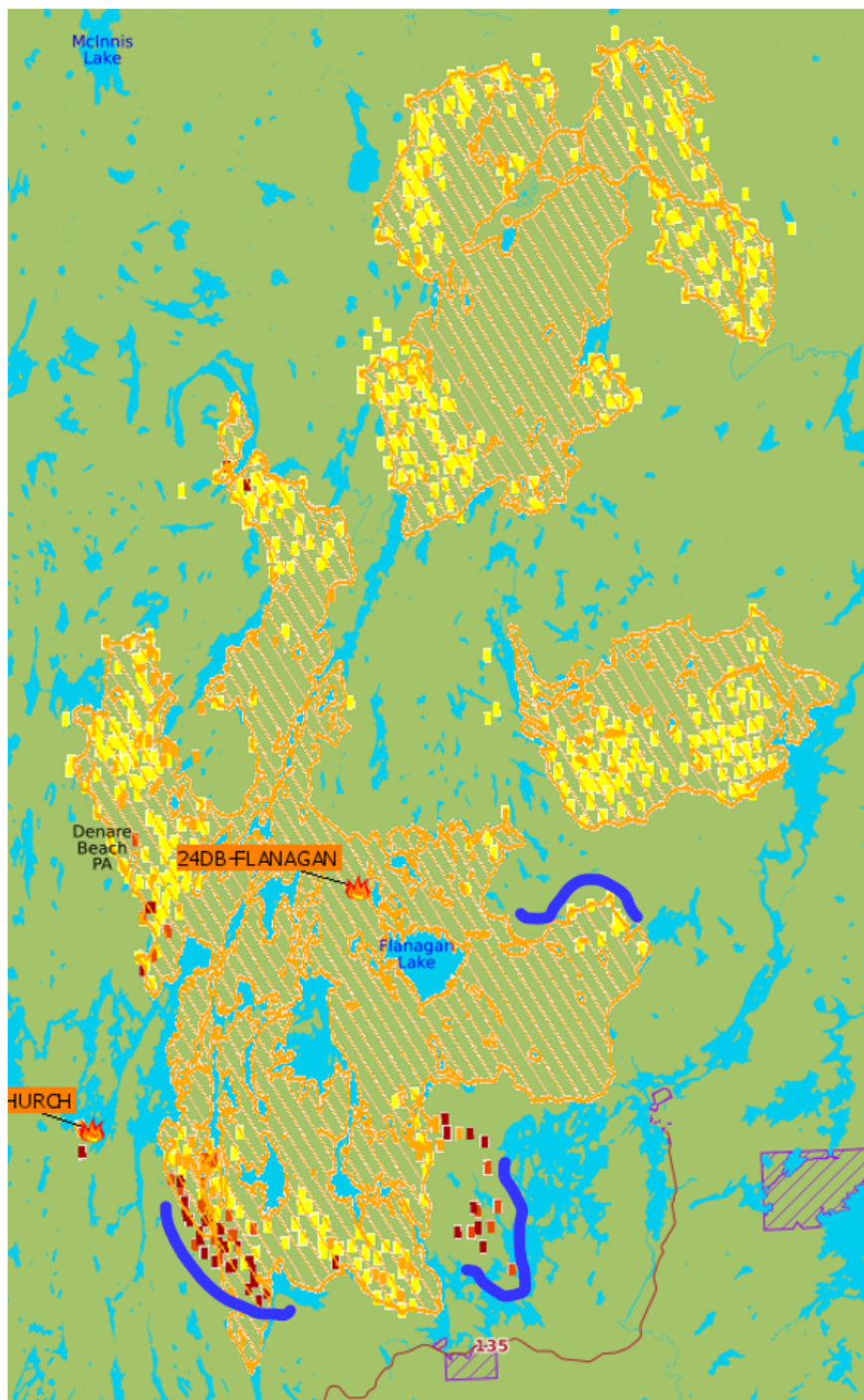

South division will work on the ignition line from earlier in the week. A burnout is planned for today with the forecast. North division is retrieving gear and working further northeast. Crews will be working hotspots on the line nearest to the community. No growth activity yesterday, August 31<sup>st</sup>.

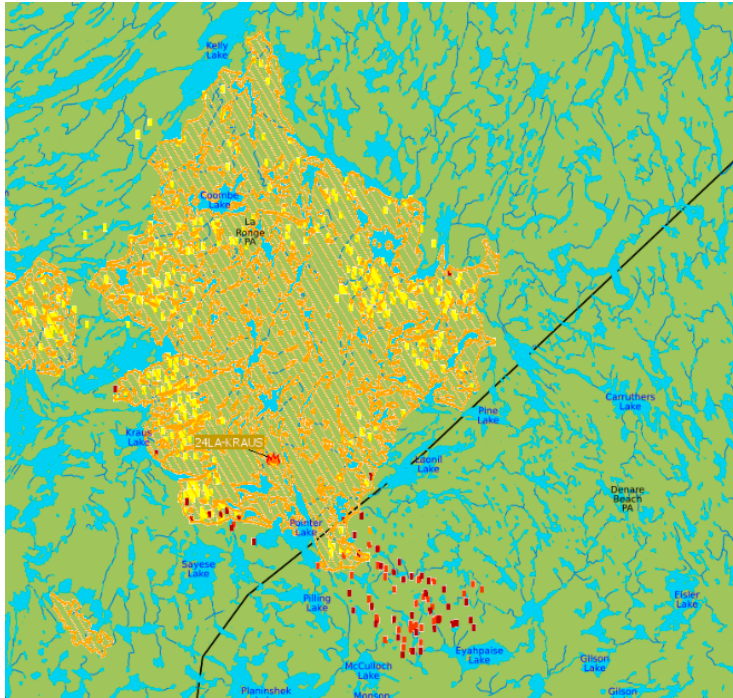

There were four jump fires that occurred yesterday, and the crews knocked down and mopped all of these fires with the largest getting to .75 Ha (lower blue line). The inversions and heavy smoke in the have delayed our crews and helicopters from getting out as early as we would like and are getting delayed for about an hour to an hour and a half. Three small islands did catch fire from spotting, but further spread has been eliminated. The same work is being done in the area on the southeast flank and are putting out hot spots in that area. The northeast sector is looking really good, and crews are working to gather up the equipment and remove it from that section of the fire.



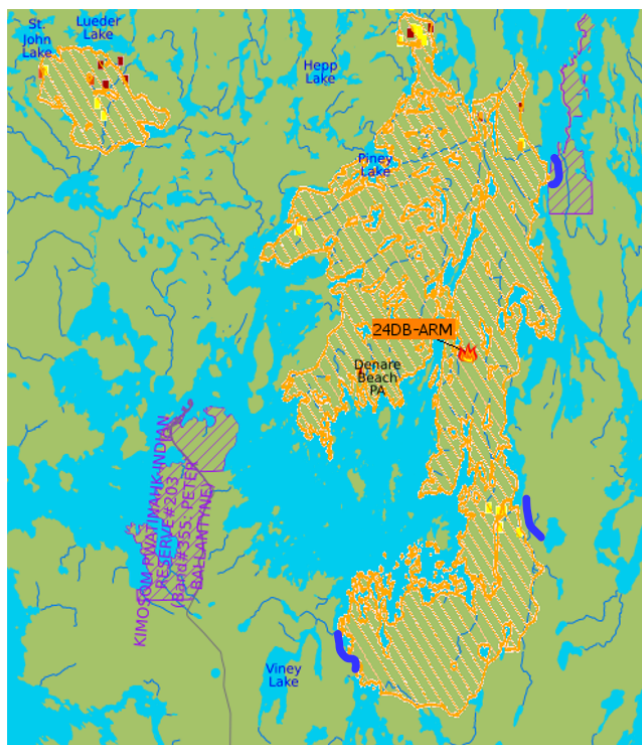

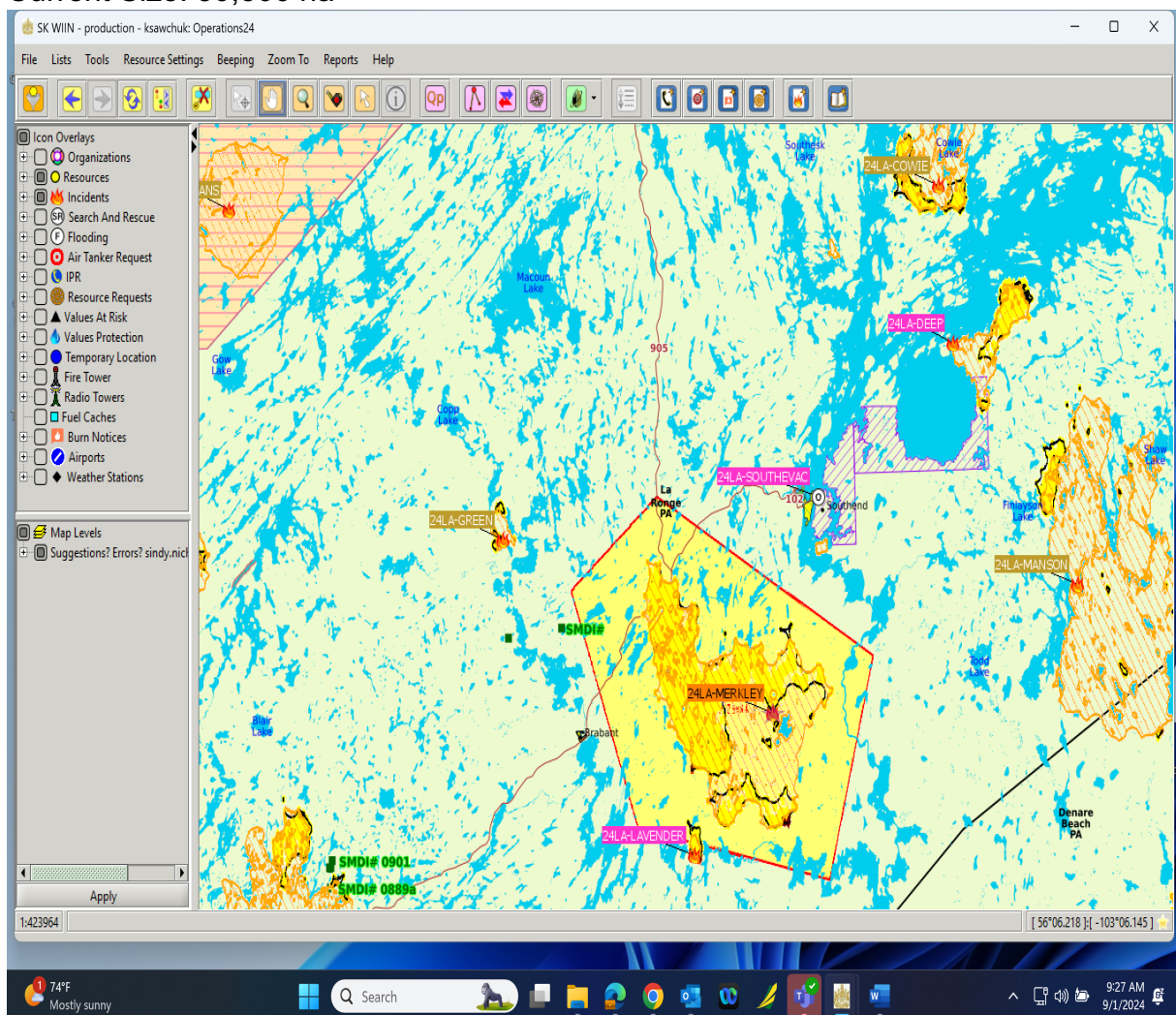

Crews will continue with value protection units. Wildcat and Fire and Flood crews continue to work on setting up sprinklers in both communities of Southend and Brabant. Will be placing a crew on the northwest of the highway and another crew from the northeast area to slow down the fire with pump and hose.

- Brabant VPU setup with Wildcat Fire Protection, completed, pumps are ready to go
- HWY camp VPU setup with ERT's, ready to go
- Southend VPU hose lines being run out to sprinkler heads attached to structures, with Fire & Flood Emergency Services and assisted by Wildcat
- Detection from Southend checked IPR &, incident created, by Malcolm Island, Reindeer Lk, 37ha, contained to island
- VPU detection checked Hepburn, landed at 1 value, mopped up around value, landed & turned on other pumps at other values
- Heli landed at Park Lk started pump, Colin, McDonald, Palmer mopped up 1 value, started pumps at other values
- Flew over Paul River, value not threatened
- VPU crew with vehicle checked Davis, started 4 pumps.

**Today:** Surface inversion is expected to break around 09:30 CST and a shallow inversion aloft ~ 1km will linger until the afternoon. The warm front to the north and upper ridge from the south will give a mix of sun and cloud. An air quality advisory is in effect due to the thick smoke.

**Max Temp:** 22°C. **Min RH:** 35%. **Winds:** S-SW 5-15 G 20-30 km/h. **Precipitation:** Nil.

**Tonight:** The surface inversion will start building near 19:00CST. The ridge from the south will give mainly clear skies. Slight risk of fog patches developing near waterbodies and in low-lying areas.

**Min Temp:** 14°C. **Max RH:** Poore recovery less than 70 %. **Winds:** S-SW 10 G 25 km/h. **Precipitation:** Nil.

**Forecast for Monday:** The upper ridge from the south will bring mainly sunny skies and light southwesterly winds.
