

WE ARE HIRING! TB PROGRAM WORKERS



The TB Program Worker (TBPW) is of vital importance to the Tuberculosis (TB) Control Program. Your role as a team member in the TB control program is important in treating TB and preventing it from spreading.

The primary function of a TBPW is to ensure that clients with TB disease or infection take their medication. People with TB who do not take their medication properly can stay infected, get the disease again, or develop and spread drug-resistant TB.

The TB Program worker delivers medications as a delegated function from the Community Health Nurse. As such, the TBPW is accountable and reports to the CHN on an ongoing and continual basis.

TB workers may also work in an expanded role providing, educating, assisting with screening and contact tracing, as part of a High TB Incidence strategy.

Program Activities:

- Assist in developing client contact lists.
- Assists with researching client TB histories.
- Participates in case conferences and strategy meetings at the TB clinic.
- Maintains an inventory of client supplies (i.e. juice, pudding, and other incentives).
- Assist nurses with home visiting and client locating.
- Participate in continuing education, attends annual TBPW workshop.
- Educates clients in the collection of sputum samples. Collects samples and brings to the clinic for the nurses.
- Encourages clients to attend TB clinics when scheduled
- Delivers appointment notices to clients and educates the clients on the importance of regular follow-up by the TB physician.
- Assist CHN with ongoing, routine, community event screening events.
